

Adaptive Capacity Checklist pilot

Join the pilot and help shape the VCRC

Are you interested in understanding which organisational strengths and capacities can enable a whole-of-organisation shift to prioritising climate change adaptation across your council?

We invite you to participate in the Adaptive Capacity Checklist pilot, a crucial step in the development of the <u>Victorian Climate Resilient Councils</u> (VCRC) program.

By joining our working group, you'll have the opportunity to review and update the <u>Adaptive</u> <u>Capacity Checklist</u> (ACC), a key tool in *Step 1 of the VCRC program: Goal setting and securing support*.

Your insights and experiences will shape the review process including how the results of the ACC can be used to identify organisational barriers and capacities which can then inform a holistic understanding of a council organisation's needs and objectives for setting up an effective climate adaptation response.

You will have the opportunity to collaborate with other leading councils to consider how the ACC can be meaningfully reported, including whether the ACC can serve as a benchmarking mechanism and engagement tool for council leadership. Other monitoring, evaluation and reporting approaches to support the overall VCRC program delivery will be considered by the working group as well.

Not only will you contribute to updating the ACC as a key tool for the VCRC, you'll also help inform a leadership engagement process. Your recommendations on engaging council leadership on climate change will foster greater support for adaptation initiatives within councils and inform a key part of the VCRC program.

We invite broad participation from any Victorian councils interested in adaptation response planning and leadership engagement. Your diverse perspectives will support a holistic approach to the update of the ACC and ensure that the design of the first step of the VCRC is tailored to meet your needs and align with your specific circumstances.

We particularly welcome involvement from councils that have previously used the ACC tool (e.g. HWAWA councils). Your invaluable experiences of using this tool will guide the review process, including monitoring, evaluation and reporting options for the broader VCRC program through this working group.

Once the ACC is updated, a subset of councils with representation from metropolitan, regional and rural local governments will pilot the updated tool and assessment process within their council with



the support of the project team. These councils will gain a greater understanding of how to design their adaptation response to work with their organisation's strengths and capacities.


Your involvement will directly shape the development of the VCRC. The pilot's results and the working group's recommendations will inform an evaluation report that will guide the Project Steering Committee in advancing the VCRC program.

Project Background

The local government sector has been identified as needing more support to adapt to climate change (Local Government Review, 2021, <u>Needs Analysis</u>, 2021). <u>Consultation</u> with sustainability officers from 52 Victorian local governments confirmed this need, highlighting a lack of support and funding, inequity in resources and capacities, low prioritisation of climate risk management, and a lack of clear guidance. In response, the <u>Western Alliance for Greenhouse Action</u> (WAGA) is leading the development of the <u>Victorian Climate Resilient Councils</u> (VCRC) program.

This program aims to guide councils in managing climate change risks and implementing actions to manage the impacts to services, operations and local communities. The program will build capacity across the local government sector to implement sustained and coordinated responses to climate change risks and provide flexibility to meet the needs and local contexts of individual councils.

WAGA, in partnership with the Victorian Greenhouse Alliances and Victorian local governments, is developing the VCRC program over 2023 - 2024 with funding from the Australian Government under the National Partnership Agreement for Disaster Risk Reduction. The implementation and roll out of the fully developed program is dependent on completing the development phase, including securing governance arrangements and further funding beyond 2024.



Pilot Project Aims

- Develop the first step, "Goal Setting and Securing Support," of the Victorian Climate Resilient Councils program.
- Identify benchmarking, monitoring, evaluation, and reporting options for the VCRC program.
- Identify effective methods for engaging council leadership.

Pilot Project Objectives

- 1. Update the existing Adaptive Capacity Checklist (ACC) and integrate it as a key assessment tool within the Victorian Climate Resilient Councils program.
- 2. Demonstrate the value of the ACC as a reporting format that can effectively identify and summarise gaps and opportunities, engaging council leadership and informing their climate adaptation goals.
- 3. Investigate the suitability of the ACC as a benchmarking tool and explore additional options for monitoring, evaluation, and reporting within the broader VCRC program.
- 4. Identify effective methods for engaging council leadership in climate adaptation response to enhance the implementation of the VCRC program.

Participating councils will commit to completing the updated ACC with support from VCRC program staff.	The completion of the pilot is estimated to take approximately three days of an officer's time, which includes training on the updated checklist, establishing internal communications and engagement processes, collecting responses from internal teams, analysing and interpreting results, and providing feedback through an evaluation session or survey response with the program team. High Level Deliverables

- 1. An updated ACC that serves as a vital tool within the VCRC program. It will assist councils in effectively identifying organisational barriers and opportunities, informing an efficient climate adaptation response.
- 2. A reporting template or output derived from the updated ACC, specifically designed for benchmarking or engaging council leadership.
- 3. Template(s), methods, or resources for effectively engaging with council leadership, ensuring clear and impactful communication.
- 4. A report evaluating the outcomes of the pilots and providing recommendations for council leadership engagement. Additionally, it will include recommendations for monitoring, evaluation, and reporting (ME&R) options for the broader VCRC program.
