We're excited to let you know that our proposal to the national Disaster Ready Fund (DRF) round 2 has passed the assessment by the Victorian Lead Agency for the DRF (Emergency Management Victoria) and has been included in Victoria's application to the Australian Government for funding.

Whilst there are no guarantees that we will go on to receive funding to continue VCRC for a three year implementation stage from next year, it's great to know that the Victorian Government support us in taking this program to the next stage. We will know if we have received the funding by the second half of this year.
